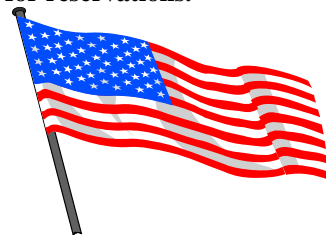

HAIL TO THE CHIEF!!!

Right Worshipful David R. Doan of Moorpark, California, was born and raised in Venice, California. He attended Santa Monica College where he received an Associate of Arts Degree in Criminal Justice. He attended the Los Angeles campus of National University where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Public Administration with honors. He is also a graduate of the FBI National Academy for law enforcement executives at Quantico, Virginia. He has been married to his wife Teri since 1977 and they have an adult son and a daughter who is in college.

He became a Police Officer for the Los Angeles Police Department in 1974 and has worked in all parts of the City including patrol, detectives, narcotics and administrative assignments. As a Captain, he has commanded the Devonshire and North Hollywood Patrol Divisions, Detective Headquarters Division, Planning and Research Division and Pacific Area.

In 1997 he was promoted to the rank of Commander of Police where he worked as the Department's Employee Relations Administrator and as the Risk Manager. In January 2002 he was promoted to his current rank of Deputy Chief of Police, in charge of reengineering the Department's management systems, including the development of a new computer tracking system required by the Federal Consent Decree. He has received many awards and commendations during his career with the Los Angeles Police Department.

He is active in many professional, community and charitable organizations, including the International Association of Chiefs of Police, the Los Angeles County Police Officer Association, and the FBI National Academy Associates. He is a member of the Rotary and has been active in the Lions and Optimists. He has served as a Director of the San Fernando Valley Charitable Foundation, which raises funds for children at risk, including children with AIDS. He is currently on the Board of Directors of the Midnight Mission in the Skid Row Section of Los Angeles.

In November 1975 he was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Triangle Lodge No. 548 where his grandfathers, father, uncles and brother belonged. Triangle Lodge is now part of Sunset Lodge No. 369.

In addition to serving as Master of this lodge in 1993, he was the President of the Temple Board for five years and served as the Officers' Coach. He is also a member of Conejo Valley Lodge No. 807 in Thousand Oaks.

Right Worshipful Doan is a Senior DeMolay and has received its Legion of Honor. He is a member of numerous Masonic organizations including the Lodge of Perfection at the Los Angeles Scottish Rite where he served as Venerable Master and has been honored with the title Knight Commander of the Court of Honor; an Ambassador of the Al Malaikah Shrine; Santa Monica Bay York Rite Bodies; Santa Ana Chapter, National Sojourners; San Juan de Los Angeles Council, Allied Masonic Degrees; and the Saint Gabriel Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine.

He served Grand Lodge as the Grand Chaplain in 1997 under Most Worshipful Allen B. Gresham. He was a member of the Grand Lodge Trial Review Committee for nine years and was Chairman for several years. He was a charter member of the Grand Lodge Research Committee and was Chairman for three years. He has served as a Trustee for the California Masonic Memorial Temple and the Nob Hill Masonic Management Corporation. In 1997 he became a Trustee of the Masonic Homes of California and served the Board as Vice-President before being elected to the office of Junior Grand Warden in 2001. He was elected Senior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of California in October of 2002, and Deputy Grand Master in October of 2003.
