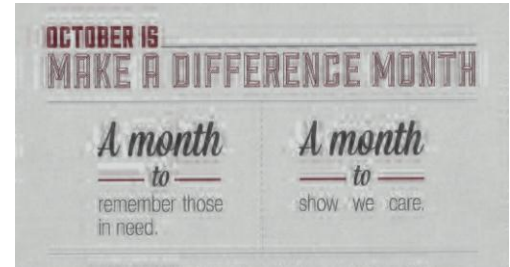
Child Literacy & Mentoring

Expanding our Fraternity's championing of our public schools, a new program has been initiated in the San Francisco area by the California Masonic Foundation, to provide needed learning opportunities for children who are at risk for falling behind in literacy. Called the Masonic Literacy Mentoring Program, it partners interested Masonic family members with students, to instill in them a love of reading, writing and learning, through interactive tutoring sessions. What a wonderful way to actively continue our support of public education!

As another great example of ways to promote literacy through our Fraternity's ongoing "Raising A Reader" shared-reading program, the above picture reflects what one of our Los Angeles Lodges is doing to support this service to our local youth. *Santa Monica Palisades Lodge 307*, besides donating financially to the Program, has formed an Education Committee and has recently donated one book each to more than 450 children attending the local School District's summer school program, for students needing extra attention keeping up their grade levels. Another excellent way of developing a close connection to the local community's educators, parents and students.
